## A Letter From Our Executive Director

2025 tested us in ways we could not have fully anticipated. The movement faced significant funding uncertainties, unexpected freezes, and shifting priorities at multiple levels, all of which directly impacted victim service organizations. Violence Prevention programming changes have been reduced or eliminated in some funding streams. At the same time, changes in policies and protections have created fear and instability for many of the survivors we serve.

**Survivors still called our 24-hour crisis line.** Families continued to seek emergency shelter and hotel program services. Children continued to need trauma-informed care. Protective orders still had to be filed. Court accompaniment, hospital response, counseling, and advocacy did not pause simply because of uncertain times.

**Bay Area Turning Point** remained committed to its mission to provide safety, advocacy, and comprehensive services to survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault. We adapted in real time. We tightened operations without compromising care. We advocated at the state and local level. We strengthened community partnerships. Most importantly, we continued saving lives. None of this happens in isolation.

I am intensely grateful to lead the dedicated staff who continue to serve with compassion, integrity, and resilience. I am thankful to our board members for their insight, leadership, and governance, which provide stability and direction as we navigate difficult times and serve survivors. Gratitude does not encapsulate the words for our volunteers who give their time, and for our donors and community partners who ensure this mission remains possible.

And most importantly, *I am grateful to the survivors who trust us.* Their courage to reach out, to share their stories, and to pursue safety is the reason we exist. It is an honor to walk alongside each one of them. Thank you for trusting us.

But despite it all, we persevered and remained present, responsive, and committed.

**Because when lives are at stake, standing still is not an option.**

As we look ahead, we do so with clarity: the need for our services has not diminished. And with the continued support of this community, Bay Area Turning Point will remain a place of safety, advocacy, and hope for years to come.

# WHY WE EXIST



Bay Area Turning Point exists to ensure that anyone experiencing domestic or sexual violence has a safe place to turn—day or night, without judgment.

Every survivor deserves a place to turn.

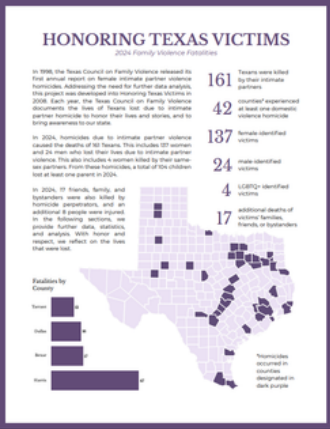
Right now, the need for safety, stability, and trauma-informed support is growing across our community. Every call answered, every door opened, and every service provided helps break cycles of violence and create pathways to healing.

## WHY IT MATTERS

Violence in our communities takes many forms — from domestic abuse that costs lives, to sexual assault that goes unreported, to childhood trauma that lasts a lifetime. In 2024, **161 Texans died due to intimate partner violence**, with **104 children left without a parent**. There were also **17 additional deaths of victims' families, friends, or bystanders**.

Across Texas, 2 in 5 women and 1 in 5 men report sexual assault in their lifetimes, and 1 in 6 Texas teens say they've experienced childhood sexual abuse. Most of these experiences go unreported, unseen, and unsupported — which is why organizations like ours are so essential.

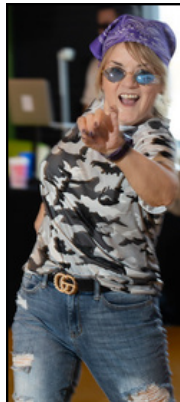

-  10,635 Individuals assisted through our 24-Hour Crisis Hotline
-  656 Adults and children via emergency shelter and the hotel program
-  23,148 Shelter days and hotel days provided
-  138,888 Meals and snacks provided
-  11,528 Hours of residential restorative services (childcare, counseling, support groups, life skills, adult & child enrichment hours)



-  525 Adults and children via the nonresidential program
-  1065 Hours of nonresidential restorative services
-  43 Adults and children in the housing program
-  117 Victim accompaniments (supporting victims in a manner that empowers their healing journey and avoids re-traumatization)
-  20,167 Individuals were reached via outreach, education, and prevention efforts

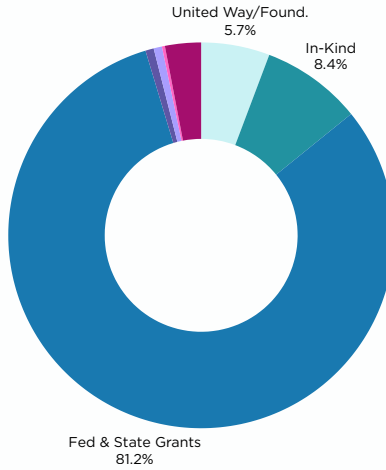

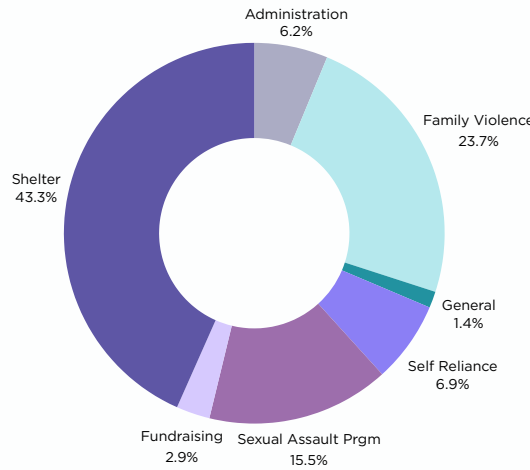

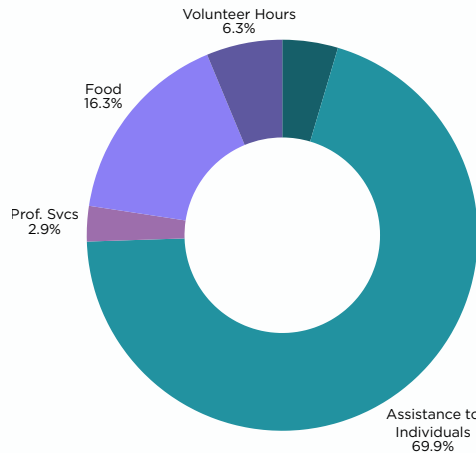
